## **LEGISLATIVE** ADVOCACY

Remove legislative and regulatory barriers that impact your ability to provide care with access to IHCA's experienced legislative advocacy team, which has a proven track record of delivering:

- Workforce solutions, including legislation that addresses systemic problems with exorbitant staffing agency price increases and holds staffing agencies accountable to regulatory standards, as well as a reformed criminal background check process that allows for more timely hiring of prospective employees
- A record-breaking \$120 million in Medicaid funding appropriations, when federal match funds are factored in, for skilled nursing facilities, assisted living programs and home health agencies
- A temporary reduction in the 85% occupancy rule to 70%, saving lowa skilled nursing facilities an estimated \$44 million
- Rock-solid legal liability immunity when responding to COVID-19 while complying with federal
  or state regulations, resulting in an estimated \$220 million in savings from frivolous lawsuits
- Regulatory relief and resource priority during the public health emergency, including more than 25 state regulatory waivers, resource priority for the COVID-19 vaccine and personal protective equipment and an additional \$14 million in CARES Act funding for skilled nursing facilities
- Prevention from harmful legislation being enacted, including video surveillance in facilities
  that would have violated residents' privacy, COVID-19 visitation and vaccine rule contradictions
  and changes to the Certificate of Need (CON) process that would have been detrimental to
  skilled nursing facilities and assisted living programs

As a member, you also have access to one of the most influential political action committees in the state, the lowa Health PAC, and powerful grassroots advocacy resources, such as our Day on the Hill event, providing you even more opportunities to connect with key decisions makers at the statehouse on issues impacting your ability to provide care.

# IOWA HEALTH CARE QUALITY PARTNERS NETWORK

As a member, you have the opportunity to join Iowa Health Care Quality Partners (IHCQP), a network of 200 independent long-term care and post-acute care providers joined together for the purpose of improving the quality and efficiency of patient care and financially rewarding providers for doing so through value-based contracts with MCOs. As a network partner you gain:

#### Access to a state-wide network

- Access to payers that prefer larger networks versus single facility contracts
- Pursuit of better contract terms facilitated by the expertise of professional network staff

#### Ability to collaborate with a select group of high-quality providers

IHCQP is the first AHCA/NCAL-affiliated provider-owned network to make the advancement to a level of clinical integration that allows collective negotiation with payers

#### Value-based payments

Access to value-based payments and contracts that recognize quality and better outcomes that individual providers often cannot be a part of due to volume; Network providers received \$1 million in value-based payments for 2020

#### Administrative/credentialing support

- Reduces administrative costs for documentation collection and submission to multiple health plans
- Monitors contract terms and notices from payers that may try to amend contracts

#### Support for claims, revenue cycle and systemic payer issues

- Identifies and solves systemic claims issues
- ▶ Reduces cost of claim issue resolution
- ▶ Provides a process and relationship with payers for escalating and resolving claims issues

#### Long-term care legal expertise

▶ Provides expert review of contracts from network staff who understand long-term care, saving you legal fees

#### Exclusive education

 Offers exclusive and specialized quality education and clinical consulting, customized to your specific needs

#### A focus on quality

IHCQP providers define their own set of quality measures, create benchmarks and aggregate existing CMS data in order to present timely, accurate quality data to payers and improve contracting options
